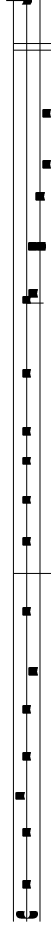
curtain. 3. Who layeth the beams of his chambers in the waters: and maketh



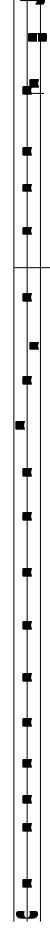
the clouds his chari-ot, and walketh upon the wings of the wind.



4. He maketh his angels spirits: and his ministers a flaming fire. 5. He laid



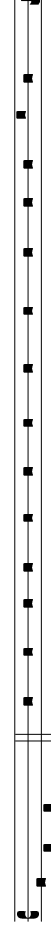
the foundations of the earth: that it never should move at a-ny time.



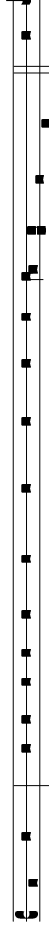
6. Thou coveredst it with the deep like as with a garment: the waters stand in



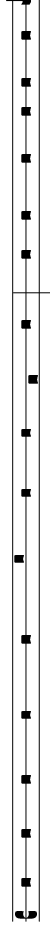
the hills. 7. At thy rebuke they flee: at the voice of thy thunder they



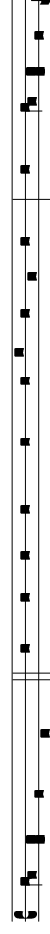
are a-fraid. 8. They go up as high as the hills, and down to the valleys




beneath: even un-to the place which thou hast appointed for them. 9. Thou




hast set them their bounds which they shall not pass: neither turn again to




cov-er the earth. 10. He sendeth the springs in-to the rivers: which run among

and sing among the branches. ¹³ He watereth the hills from above: the earth




is fil-led with the fruit of thy works. ¹⁴ He bringeth forth grass for




the cattle: and green herb for the ser-vice of men.¹⁵ That he may bring food




out of the earth, and wine that maketh glad the heart of man: and oil to




make him a cheerful countenance, and bread to strengthen man's heart.




¹⁶ The trees of the Lord al-so are full of sap: even the cedars of Libanus which



he hath planted.¹⁷ Wherein the birds make their nests: and the fir-trees are




a dwelling for the stork.¹⁸ The high hills are a refuge for the wild goats:




and so are the stony rocks for the conies.¹⁹ He appointed the moon for certain




seasons: and the sun knoweth his going down.²⁰ Thou makest darkness that




it may be night: wherein all the beasts of the forest do move.²¹ The lions roar-




ing after their prey: do seek their meat from God.²² The sun ariseth, and they




get them away together: and lay them down in their dens.²³ Man goeth forth



to his work, and to his labour: un-til the ev'ning. ²⁴ O Lord, how manifold




are thy works: in wisdom hast thou made them all; the earth is full of thy




riches. ²⁵ So is the great and wide sea al-so: wherein are things creeping

is that Levi-athan: whom thou hast made to take his pastime therein.²⁷ These




wait all upon thee: that thou mayest give them meat in due season.²⁸ When
